

He Mahi Toi Kōhatu

Pebble/Rock Art



Ngā whaingā:

- Waihangatia tētahi mahi toi ki ngā kōhatu, he pikitia pai ki a koe.

Ngā Rauemi:

- He momo kōhatu (he nui, he waewaenui, he iti).
 - Ētahi atu rawa taiao.
 - He pepa he pepa mārō rānei.
 - He kāpia.
 - He pene whītau.
1. Kimihia he momo kōhatu mai i te māra, te ngahere, te awa, te tātahi rānei. Kimihia ētahi atu rawa taiao e hiahia ana koe hei whakaniko i tō pikitia.
 2. Tāhoratia te pepa, te pepa mārō rānei ki runga i tētahi papa mārō (he papa he tēpu rānei).
 3. Whakaritea ngā kōhatu/toka ki runga i te pepa, te pepa mārō rānei e hiahia ana koe. Tērā pea, he momo taura, he mea o te taiao he kararehe he putiputi me ērā atu. Hangaia he mea pai ki a koe.
 4. Tāpiripiria ētahi rawa taiao memeha e hiahia ana koe hei whakaniko i tō pikitia.
 5. Whakapiria ngā mea katoa ki te pepa, te pepa mārō rānei ki te kāpia.
 6. Tāngia memeha e hiahia ana koe ki te whakaniko i tō pikitia.
 7. Inā ka oti pai tō pikitia, whakaaturia ki tō whānau.

Pebble/Rock Art

Goal: Create a piece of pebble/rock art.

Material: Variety of stones (large, medium, small), paper or material.

1. Collect a range of pebbles/stones from the garden, bush, river or beach. Find other natural materials to enhance your picture.
2. Lay the paper or cardboard on a hard surface (floor or table top).
3. Arrange the pebbles/stones on top of the paper or cardboard as you like. It could be a pattern, something in nature, an animal or flower. Make something you like.
4. Add some of the other nature materials to enhance your picture, if you want.
5. Stick everything to the paper or cardboard with glue.
6. Add drawings to enhance your picture, if you want.
7. When your picture is finished, show your whānau.
