

# He Rapunga Manu Māori

## Native Bird Search

E rite ana te whāinga o tēnei ngohe ki te kēmu 'Rapunga Taonga' engari ko ngā taonga, ko ngā manu māori.

This activity is similar to 'Treasure Hunt', except that the treasures are native birds.

He ngohe mahi tahi, mahi ngātahi tēnei.

This is a collaborative activity.



### Ngā Rauemi | The Materials

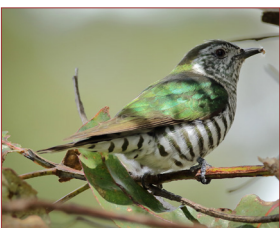
1. Whārangi 1: Te rārangi whakaturuma
  - Sheet 1: The checklist
2. Whārangi 2: Ngā whakaāhua o ngā manu māori
  - Sheet 2: The pictures of native birds
3. Tekau ngā kōpaki iti (mō ngā whakaahua o ngā manu)
  - 10 small envelopes (for the pictures of the birds)
4. He kutikuti (hei tapahi i ngā whakaahua o ngā manu)
  - A pair of scissors (to cut out the pictures of the birds)
5. He rorohiko (hei whakarongo ki te tangi o ngā manu)
  - A computer to listen to the call of the birds

### Ngā Whakaritenga | The Preparations

Mā ngā mātua, ngā tuākana rānei e whakarite ngā āhuatanga mō tēnei ngohe.

The parents or older siblings will carry out the preparations for this activity.

1. Tapahia ngā pikitia o ngā manu, purua ki roto i ngā kōpaki iti.  
Cut up the pictures of the birds, put them into the small envelopes.
2. Hunaia ngā kōpaki (titiro ki ngā tohutohu kei raro iho nei mō ngā wāhi huna).  
Hide the envelopes (refer to the instructions below for the hiding places).



## Kātahi Ka Tīmata te Rapunga | The search begins

Ka haere ngā tamariki ki waho i te kāinga, ki te rapu i ngā manu māori.

The children go outside to search for the native birds.

Ka whai haere ngā tamariki i ngā tohutohu kei raro iho nei. Mā ngā tuākana, ngā tēina e āwhina.

The children follow the instructions below. The older children help the younger children.

Ka kitea ia manu māori, ka tirohia taua manu ki te rārangi whakaturuma, kātahi ka tuhia te tohu tika ki te whakaahua.

As the tamariki locate each native bird, they look for that bird on the checklist and tick the tickbox.

## Anei ngā tohutohu | Here are the instructions

Haere ki waho i te kāinga

Go outside

1. Haere ki te rākau nui rawa atu, kei reira ka kitea tētahi manu e huna ana.

Go to the biggest tree, there you will find a bird hiding.

2. Haere ki te māra putiputi o mua, kei reira ka kitea tētahi manu e huna ana.

Go to the front garden, there you will find a bird hiding.

3. Haere ki te iringa kākahu, kei reira ka kitea tētahi manu e huna ana.

Go to the clothes line, there you will find a bird hiding.

4. Haere ki te tūnga waka, kei reira ka kitea tētahi manu e huna ana.

Go to the car port/park, there you will find a bird hiding.

5. Haere ki te pouaka reta, kei reira ka kitea tētahi manu e huna ana.

Go to the letter box, there you will find a bird hiding.

6. Haere ki te tatau o mua o te whare, kei reira ka kitea tētahi manu e huna ana.

Go to the front door of the house, there you will find a bird hiding.

7. Haere ki te tatau o muri o te whare, kei reira ka kitea tētahi manu e huna ana.

Go to the back door of the house, there you will find a bird hiding.

8. Haere ki te taiepa o muri, kei reira ka kitea tētahi manu e huna ana.

Go to the back fence, there you will find a bird hiding.

E hoki ki te whare, kuhu ki roto

Return to the house, go inside

9. Haere ki te kīhini, kei reira ka kitea tētahi manu e huna ana.

Go to the kitchen, there you will find a bird hiding.

10. Haere ki te ruma noho, kei reira ka kitea te manu whakamutunga e huna ana.

Return to the house, go inside, go to the lounge, there you will find the last bird hiding.

Kia mutu te rapunga taonga, ā, ka kitea ngā manu katoa, ka whakarongo ngā tamariki ki te tangi o ia manu mā te hononga ipurangi kei raro o ia whakaahua manu.

When the treasure hunt is finished and all the birds have been found, the children can listen to the call of each bird via the link under the pictures of each bird.
