

Pona 1 - Hī Ika

Knots 1 - Fishing Knot

Nā tōku Pāpā au i whakaako ki ngā mahi hī ika. He pona pai tēnei hei herenga mātau, māhe, hononga takahuri hoki.

My Dad taught me to fish. This knot can be used to attach hooks, sinkers and swivels to your fishing line.

Taputapu / Kupu hou | Equipment / Vocabulary

pona – knot

mātau – hook

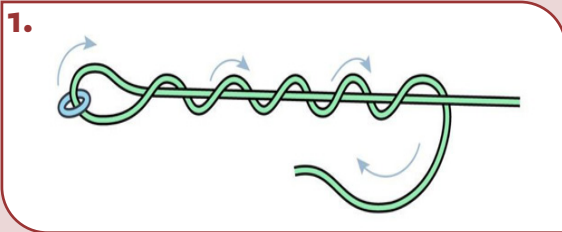
māhē – sinker

hononga takahuri – swivel

aho – fishing line

kuhu (na) – thread

whakakikī (a) - tighten

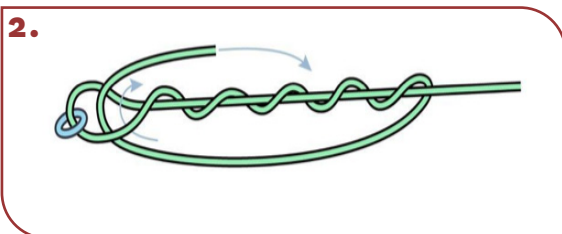


Kuhuna te aho i te māhē.

Thread the line through the sinker.

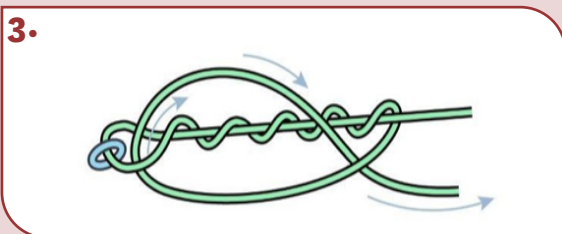
Hurihia te aho kia rima ngā hurihanga.

Wrap around the line five times.



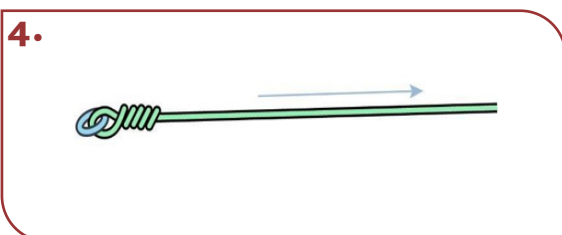
Hoki whakamurī ki waenganui i te māhē me te hurihanga tuatahi.

Thread back through the loop between the sinker and the first twist.



Hoki anō ki te hurihanga whakamutunga.

Thread back through the loop of the last twist.



Whakakikīa te pona o te aho.

Pull the line tight to tighten the knot.

Tapahia te toenga aho.

Trim the excess line.
